While the Call Committee faithfully continues the process of searching for the next called pastor at Friendship, the departure of Pastor Tim, on June 12, creates a gap in pastoral coverage until our new pastor arrives. Thus, our Council president and vice-president, Mary Ann Icenhour and Wade Cline, have worked with the North Carolina Synod to present a plan that was approved by Church Council to provide pastoral coverage during this time of transition.

Pastor Gary Haddock will begin providing pastoral care coverage on Sunday, June 12, including hospital visits, officiating funerals and "on-call" coverage. In addition, he will staff office hours one morning a week.

Pastor Mary Louise Sitton will provide worship leadership each week, including preaching the word and presiding at the table. Pastor Sitton is from Hickory, went to school at Claremont High School, Lenoir-Rhyne University and Lutheran Theological Southern Seminary. Most recently, Pastor Sitton served Immanuel Lutheran Church in Blountville, Tn (2016-2021), which is the oldest Lutheran Church in Tennessee. (Ask her how she became known as "the mild lady.")

Jesus tells his disciples, "I will not leave you as orphans" John 14:18, and has again provided for us wonderful pastoral leadership. We give thanks for the work of the Holy Spirit, the NC Synod and our Church Council. Thanks be to God!

April 12, 2022, Regular Meeting in Person

Members present: Marty Buff, Wade Cline, Eric Frye, Tyler Hall, Mary Ann Icenhour, Sandra Icenhour, Pat Payne, Gary Richey, Steve Shealy, Monica Stafford, Jimmy Watts, Pastor Tim Canniff -Kuhn, and Dana Frye. Absent: John Bostian.

President Mary Ann Icenhour called the meeting to order and shared a devotion.

Motion by Wade Cline; seconded by Sandra Icenhour to approve the minutes from the regular meeting on March 8, 2022, and the electronic vote on March 23, 2022. Motion carries.

Treasurer's report for the month was distributed. Steve shared that giving for current was down from last year while expenses continue to increase.

TEAM REPORTS:

Administration – Sandra Icenhour – No report.

Care – Wade Cline – 100 lbs. of food was donated this past month; Approximately 55 kids and 20 adults enjoyed the Easter Egg Hunt; 47 units of blood was received at the blood drive. Plans are underway for the BBQ Benefit for Katelyn McKinney on April 30. Help is needed for this fundraiser.

Learn – John Bostian – Nikki Icard and Payton Boyles are heading up VBS and are working with St Luke, Reformation, Taylors-ville Presbyterian to have a combined VBS at Friendship. More details to follow net month.

Worship - Monica Stafford - No report.

Share – Jimmy Watts – Working to get information to the Taylorsville Times with things that are happening at Friendship.

Finance – Steve Shealy – No additional financial report.

Rusha Austin Scholarship – Marty Buff – 5/6 packets are still out for the scholarship. Deadline is April 15.

Preschool – Pat Payne – Going great. Fundraisers are being discussed at the team meetings.

Building & Grounds (BAG) – Eric Frye – Lights for the Nave have just come in but most likely will not be installed by Easter.

Technology – Tyler Hall – Internet speed has been fixed. CREW has rehearsed their video and it is ready. Screen size needs to be looked at and our version of Pro Presenter is outdated.

Cemetery – Gary Richey – The team had 9 people show up for the workday on April 2. Gary feels there was a lot accomplished with a lot still that needs attention. The worse stones have been repaired. The church council needs to be notified when there has been a tombstone broken or fallen over. Grave diggers need to be held responsible if one is broken when a grave is dug. May 14 will be the next workday.

Pastor Tim continues to use his time preparing worship services, attending to administrative duties, pastoral care, and home visits. Please let him know if you know someone who needs a visit. The Call Committee has interviewed 6 candidates and is working to schedule second interviews where needed. Mary Ann will be in touch with the Synod to have pulpit supply after Pastor Tim's current contract is up.

NEW BUSINESS:

Motion by Mary Ann Icenhour; seconded by Marty Buff to move back to pre-covid guidelines on building usage. Motion carries.

Mary Ann reported that the Nutrition Program current contract will expire on June 30, 2022. Currently the numbers are the same and they continue meeting at the church in person on Mondays only.

There being no other business the meeting adjourned with prayer.

Our next regular monthly meeting will be at 7 pm on Tuesday, May 10, 2022. Monica Stafford is scheduled to share a devotion.
