And [the angel of the Lord] came to [Mary] and said, "Greetings, favored one! The Lord is with you." But she was much perplexed by his words and pondered what sort of greeting this might be. The angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. Luke 1:28-30

Grace to you and peace in the name of the Messiah, Jesus Christ, the one for whom we wait. Amen.

As hard as it is to believe, we find ourselves in the season of Advent. The season of expectation and hope; the season of anticipation and waiting.

We wait for the Incarnation of God. In Advent, we celebrate with joy as we hear again and experience the story of Jesus' birth. The promised Messiah has come among us as a baby born in the worst of circumstances. We wait for his coming into this world and we wait for the true message of hope and peace that he brings to us. Most of all, we wait in long and expected hope of the salvation that can only be found through his life, death and resurrection.

We also wait in a different way: with sure and certain hope of the mystery of the faith: Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again. Not only do we wait for the babe in a manger, but we also wait with sureness and certainty of Christ's coming again. Just as he promised, Jesus went on from this world to prepare a place for us, and just as he promised he will come again, so that we may all be united eternally as one. Advent is about this kind of waiting, too: waiting for Christ's coming again.

Waiting can be exciting at times, especially this time of year. Gifts are being purchased for loved ones, and now, we wait with anticipation as we give and receive those gifts. But waiting is also important as we continue our faith walk as disciples of Christ during this time. We are called to remain focused on what God is calling us to do to make his advent among us known in the world. Waiting begins to look like spending precious time with family and friends, and glorifying God through worship and service during this holiday season.

But sometimes waiting is not easy. The seasons of Advent and Christmas can bring about sadness as we remember past times spent with loved ones who are no longer with us, strained relationships and miles that separate loved ones. It can be easy for us to lose the focus and meaning of the holiday season with all of the attention on shopping, gift giving and the secularized meanings of Christmas.

No matter where we find ourselves in this season of waiting, we cling to the words from Luke with the annunciation of Jesus' birth. In the first chapter, the birth narrative begins as the angel Gabriel visits the virgin, Mary. The text tells us of Mary's confusion and anxiety over the presence of the angel and in his words, "Greeting, favored one." How could a lowly virgin have found favor with God? The angel continues to assure Mary saying, "the Lord is with you."

This advent and Christmas season let us never forget that we too have found favor with God and that God is with us. In our baptism, we are chosen children of God; people who are called to do great things. And, God is with us every step of the way as we do these things and as we wait for Christ's advent this season. Emmanuel, God with us! Even as we get caught up in the busy-ness of the season or as we remember great times with loved ones in the past, God is with us and he has favored us. Let us wait with anticipation and hope as Jesus comes!

I wish you and your family a blessed Advent and Christmas season. I pray that you may see the presence of Christ with you as you spend time with your families, your friends and with you church family. And I pray that as we wait together for the coming of Christ, we may not lose sight of the miracle that happened so long ago in a manger in Bethlehem. May we also not lose sight of the miracle that is still happening today as we answer the call to be Christ's disciples, carrying out his work in the world so that all my know of his love. God bless you this season and always.

President Doug Ramsey called the meeting to order.

Motion by Michelle Miller; seconded by Chris Bowman to approve the agenda as presented. Motion carries.

Wade Cline shared a devotion.

Lori Overcash from the Preschool was present for an opportunity for Council get some one-on-one time with her and for her to share an update on the preschool. Everything is going great!

Motion by Wade Cline; seconded by Tamara Stafford to approve minutes from September 16, Regular Meeting, and the October 13, electronic vote. Motion carries.

Treasurers report was distributed. Motion by Michelle Miller; seconded by Angie Mooney to approve. Motion carries. Charlie Sipe discussed the 2026 spending plan and sharing that overall, there was a 3% increase form 2025. Motion from the Finance committee (no second required) to approve and present the spending plan to the congregation at the annual meeting. Motion caries. Charlie will get with Penny and have copies out for pick up by Sunday, November 2.

TEAM ASSIGNMENTS/REPORTS:

Administration - Hannah Bostian - No report.

<u>Care</u> – Tamara Stafford – Meals are being delivered after the Monday night community suppers; 46 units were collected at the blood drive on October 12, next drive is January 4; God's Work Our Hands will be October 25 and several projects are lined up; Thanksgiving meals will be prepared and delivered November 27; looking to revamp the Emergency Meal this year due to low attendance.

Learn – Nikki Icard – No report.

<u>Worship</u> – Chris Jolly – There is a financial need in the Holy Lands. A speaker will be at Friendship on December 7 at both services for a temple talk and everyone will have the opportunity to purchase items made from olive wood to support the Holy Lands during this time. The area pastors will be meeting to discuss the Advent season services and the Thanksgiving service will be at St John's on November 26.

Motion carries. <u>Preschool</u> – Monica Stafford – Motion from the Preschool team (no second required) to put \$26,000 from their regular account and half of the \$42,000 designated funds held in the church account, into an interest-bearing money market account. Motion by Doug Ramsey; seconded by Chris Jolly to amend the motion to state \$26,000 from the preschool regular account and \$42,094 from the designated funds held by the church, be deposited into the money market account at Taylorsville Savings Bank. The principal funds from the designated gift remains subject to council authority. Amendment motion carries. The preschool will not have Breakfast with Santa this year.

Building & Grounds (BAG) - Eric Frye - No report.

<u>Technology</u> – Wade Cline – It was asked about a light to be installed over the choir area in the sanctuary. Wade will get with Tyler Hall and see options and prices.

Our purpose: The Technology Ministry Team supports the mission of Friendship by using technology to help people encounter the Gospel with clarity, accessibility, and hospitality. This ministry ensures that worship—both in-person and online—is presented with excellence, and that the church's digital communication and tools strengthen the life of the congregation.

As Lutherans, we value the proclamation of God's Word, welcoming all people, and equipping disciples for service. In a digital age, technology becomes one of the ways we extend that welcome, proclaim the Gospel, and stay connected as the Body of Christ.

The Technology Ministry Team helps create a worship environment where people can hear, see, and participate fully—whether they are physical present in worship or joining from home.

Ministry Responsibilities

We provide technological support for worship and various ministry in the following ways: provide audio, visual, and lighting support during worship services; manage livestreaming, recording, and the digital presence of worship; prepare slides, videos, and digital elements used during services, receptions and special ministries; and troubleshoot issues quickly and calmly during live worship.

We strive to be digitally hospitable by: creating a welcoming and accessible experience for online worshipers; ensuring that worship streams, recordings, and digital resources reflect the warmth and care of the church and align with our vision/mission; and maintaining consistency and quality across all digital platforms.

We serve to be good stewards of our technological resources by: maintaining equipment such as soundboards, tablets, microphones, cameras, computers, and projectors; helping to evaluate and recommend upgrades as the ministry grows; and practicing faithful stewardship of our resources—balancing quality with cost-effectiveness.

Other important aspects of the work of this team is to recruit, train, and support volunteers who assist with worship technology; create clear instructions and user-friendly guides for all equipment and tasks; and encourage teamwork, spiritual growth, and a supportive ministry environment.

Through the faithful work of the Technology Ministry Team, God's Word is heard clearly, the congregation is connected in new ways, and people near and far are welcomed into the worshiping community of Christ.
